our story of faithfulness

Every church has a beginning. Ours began with a simple conviction—a gospel witness was needed in Gulf Breeze.

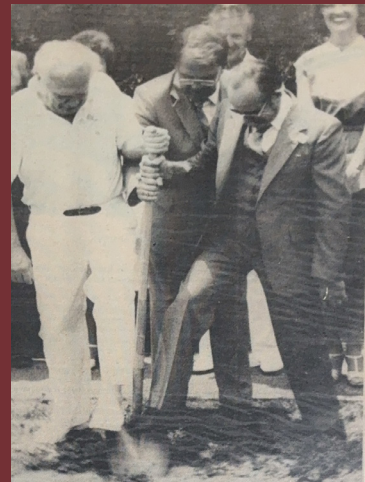
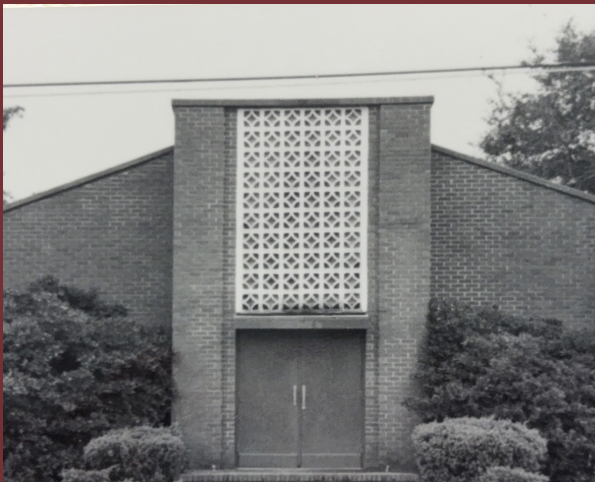
In 1955, Dr. Tucker and the congregation of Billory Baptist Church in Navarre held a tent revival in our community with the prayer of planting a new church. What began beneath the shade of oak trees at the Futrell home soon moved into the home of Graham and Elizabeth Renfro, where a small group of believers gathered to worship, study God's Word, and pray together.

As the congregation grew, they relocated to the Benson Building along Highway 98. Through the partnership of Billory Baptist Church and the Florida Baptist Convention, a permanent place of worship was constructed. With its completion, First Baptist Church Gulf Breeze was officially established as a congregation.

Like many churches, our early years brought challenges. Financial realities required the church to return to mission status for a season. Yet God was not finished with His work. Brownsville Baptist Church in Pensacola faithfully invested in this young congregation, and in 1957, Rev. Haylock became our first pastor. Through the generosity and encouragement of fellow believers, God strengthened the foundation of what would become a thriving church for generations to come.

From the very beginning, First Baptist Gulf Breeze has understood that healthy churches do more than grow—they send.

In 1962, under the leadership of Rev. Robert Glass, our church planted Santa Rosa Shores Baptist Church. That work would eventually lead to the planting of First Baptist Church Navarre in 1985, extending the reach of the gospel across our region. Our commitment to multiplication has continued through the years as we have partnered with churches and ministries to advance the Kingdom of God.





As God continued to bless the ministry, our facilities expanded to meet the needs of a growing congregation. In 1973, our current Worship Center was completed and dedicated to the glory of God. Through subsequent generations, our church family stepped forward in faith through the Venture in Faith capital campaign in 1981 and additional renovation projects in 1993, 1997, and 2001, including the construction of the Renfroe Building—named in honor of Graham and Elizabeth Renfroe, whose hospitality and faith played such an important role in the birth of our church.



Our campus has never been merely a place for Sunday worship. It has served our community by housing Pensacola Beach Elementary School and Santa Rosa Community Preschool, opening our doors to children, families, and neighbors while demonstrating the love of Christ in practical ways.

God has also expanded our vision far beyond Gulf Breeze. Through partnerships in New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, North Dakota, New Hampshire, Ohio, England, and Guatemala, our members have faithfully served, supported missionaries, and answered God's call to the mission field. We have ministered through Florida Baptist Disaster Relief in times of crisis and helped establish Misión Casa under the leadership of Pastor Gabriel Vargas, extending the gospel to our Spanish-speaking community.



Looking back, one truth is unmistakable: God has always been faithful. He was faithful in our beginnings. He was faithful through seasons of uncertainty. He was faithful as churches were planted, missionaries were sent, buildings were constructed, and lives were transformed by the gospel. Yet this story is not only about God's faithfulness. It is also about the faithfulness of His people.



Generation after generation, ordinary men and women prayed, gave sacrificially, served faithfully, and trusted God with a future they would never fully see. Because of their generosity, resilience, and unwavering commitment to Christ, we enjoy the blessings of this church today. Their faithfulness has become our legacy.

our vision

For seventy years, First Baptist Church Gulf Breeze has been guided by a simple mission: helping people experience God's love and live in His grace. Every generation has faithfully stewarded what God entrusted to them so the next generation could hear the gospel.

Today, we have the opportunity to do the same.

Throughout our history, those who came before us never built only for themselves. They built because they believed God was still calling people to Himself. They invested because they believed the church's greatest days were not behind them, but ahead. Their faithfulness created spaces where children learned the Bible, families found hope, missionaries were sent, churches were planted, and countless people came to faith in Jesus Christ.

Because of their sacrifice, hundreds of people have professed faith in Christ and followed Him in baptism. Lives have been transformed, families restored, leaders equipped, and the gospel proclaimed throughout our community and around the world.

We believe God is not finished writing that story.

As we look toward the future, we recognize that faithful stewardship requires faithful preparation. Every home requires care, and every ministry facility must be periodically renewed so it can continue serving those who walk through its doors. This initiative will allow us to renovate our Worship Center, creating a welcoming environment that reflects the hospitality of Christ and provides an excellent setting for worship, discipleship, and ministry for years to come.

At the same time, we are preparing for significant future needs by setting aside resources to replace aging HVAC systems and the Worship Center roof. Rather than allowing these necessary expenses to become overwhelming burdens in the years ahead, we have the opportunity to address them wisely today. By planning ahead and reducing the impact of future deferred maintenance, we can right-size our budget and devote more of our resources to what matters most—the mission God has given us.

our vision

Because every dollar redirected for emergencies repairs is another dollar that could help someone hear the gospel.

It means continuing to serve alongside our local schools, providing encouragement, practical support, and a faithful Christian witness to students, teachers, and families. It means strengthening our partnerships in our own community while continuing to send teams and support missions across our nation and around the world. It means remaining ready to answer God's call if He leads us to plant another church, just as He has used First Baptist Gulf Breeze to multiply gospel ministry throughout our history.

This is who we have always been.

We were planted because faithful believers looked beyond themselves and believed Gulf Breeze needed a gospel witness. We planted churches because we believed every community deserves a faithful church. We have invested in missions because we believe every nation deserves to hear the good news of Jesus Christ.

That same calling remains unchanged.

This campaign is not about renovating a building. It is about renewing our commitment to the mission God has entrusted to us. It is about stewarding today's resources so tomorrow's generations can experience God's love, hear His Word, and find new life in Christ.

The prophet Haggai reminded God's people that their work was about more than rebuilding a temple. Through their obedience, God was preparing a future they could scarcely imagine. In the same way, our faithfulness today will bless people we may never meet this side of heaven.

We cannot know every life that will be changed because of the investments we make today. But we know this: God has been faithful in every chapter of our story, and we believe He is leading us into another season of gospel impact.

As we honor the past, we do so with our eyes fixed on the future. We are trusting that the God who planted this church, sustained this church, and has faithfully used this church for nearly seventy years will continue to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine for His glory.

a legacy of faith

My grandparents were charter members of this church in the late 1950s, and I was born and raised here. I had loving, godly parents and grandparents who taught me about Jesus from an early age. By the time I was seven or eight, I understood that I was a sinner and that only Jesus could provide salvation through His death on the cross. This church has been a tremendous part of my life and my family's Christian journey. I even met my wife, Rita, through Vacation Bible School here at First Baptist. God has been so faithful, and I am grateful for the way this church has impacted generations of our family. Whether providing a place for students to practice, opening its doors to families evacuating during a hurricane, or simply giving our church a place to gather and serve, that building has been used for God's purposes. I often think how proud my in-laws would be to see how God has continued to use what began with a small gathering in their home. They started with a little building over there—and now look what we have."

As we began looking closely at our facilities, we discovered years of deferred maintenance and significant needs—from aging air conditioners and electrical systems to the roof, sanctuary, and other areas of our campus. But what has been most remarkable has not simply been the needs we have discovered; it has been the way our church family has responded. As projects were identified, people stepped forward and said, "I can do that." Others gave generously from their hard-earned resources to help make these improvements possible. Ideas emerged from conversations throughout the church, including the Legacy Room—which has helped us remember and celebrate our history. Before we even began a formal capital campaign, our church family had already given generously toward these projects. We have seen again and again that when God's people recognize a need, they respond with generosity, service, and faith. Now we have an opportunity to build on that faithfulness by establishing a better way to plan and prepare for the future God has entrusted to us.

There was a time when my wife and I realized we had gotten far away from God. We knew we needed to get our lives back in order and began trusting Him again. Almost immediately, I lost my job and found myself looking for another. When God provided a new job, it came with a pay cut. Yet we had committed to trust God, and we began tithing again after 15 years. Even with a smaller paycheck and greater commitment to giving, God took care of us. Looking back, I can see that He was faithful even when we were not. When we finally turned back to Him and trusted Him with our lives and our finances, He gave us more than we could have asked for. I can honestly say that with a smaller paycheck, I have more satisfaction at home, and God has made sure that we have not done without. He is faithful.

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QUESTIONS & DISCUSSION

faithful prayer / week one

MONDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
Psalm 1

Delight in the Lord today, meditate on his Word and ask the Lord to give you ears to hear him and what it means to find delight in Him.

TUESDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
Psalm 51:1-10

Ask the Lord to examine your heart and mind as well as the hearts and minds of his people in the church, that our hearts would be aligned with our actions.

WEDNESDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
Ezra 3:11 + James 1:2-4

Spend some time today giving thanks to the Lord. Thank Him for the challenges present in your life.

THURSDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
Exodus 33:12-23

Ask the Father to teach you his way, that you would know him, and His glory would be revealed to you.

FRIDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
1 Corinthians 11:1

Pray that you will take advantage of opportunities to serve within the community this week.

JOINING GOD'S WORK

HAGGAI 1:12-15

QUESTIONS & DISCUSSION

How can we reconcile hardship in our lives coming from the Lord?
What in your life is a hurdle to obeying the Lord? (v.12)

The children of Israel often repent and eventually fall back into sinful habits. How can we overcome our tendency to wander?

What elements of repentance do you see in the scriptures?

God shows his presence with his people through the words, "I am with you, declares the Lord" (v. 13). This presence isn't based on Israel's obedience in building the temple but motivates it. How does this dynamic reflect our obedience today?

Haggai 1:14 says the Lord roused the spirit of Zerubbabel and all the remnant of the people. How has God awakened your spirit to participate in his work?

faithful prayer / week two

MONDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
Exodus 3:14-15

Reflect on the Name of God: The Great "I AM." Thank Him that he is not far from you; He does not stand far off from his people but commits His redemptive presence to His people when they return to Him.

TUESDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
Haggai 1:12

Pray to recognize areas where personal comfort or busy routines have taken first place over God's priorities. Ask for a soft heart that hears His voice through Scripture rather than the noise of daily life.

WEDNESDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
1 Timothy 2:1-4

Pray for the leaders in our church. Ask the Lord to grant them the same humble willingness to obey his promptings immediately, as those in Haggai's time, without delay or excuse.

THURSDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
Matthew 6:25-34 + Isaiah 41:10

Pray over any areas of anxiety, weakness, or discouragement within yourself and our church.

FRIDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
Ephesians 3:14-20 + Haggai 1:14

Just as God stirred the Spirits of Zerubbabel, Joshua, and the remnant, ask him to spark fresh enthusiasm and passion within your own Spirit for His Kingdom work.

Confess times when you have worked hard for things that do not satisfy, missing the true peace God offers.

WEDNESDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
Proverbs 3:1-10

Pray for strength and a desire to put God first in your daily time, money, and choices.

THURSDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
2 Corinthians 4:7-11

Ask for courage to obey God's voice right away, even when the task looks hard or small.

FRIDAY

SCRIPTURE FOR REFLECTION:
Acts 5:1-10 + Matthew 6:19-24

Pray for our church, asking the Father to reveal to us if we are putting our own comforts and homes before His Kingdom.

HAGGAI

CHAPTER ONE

COMMAND TO REBUILD THE TEMPLE

¹In the second year of King Darius, on the first day of the sixth month, the word of the Lord came through the prophet Haggai to Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, the governor of Judah, and to Joshua son of Jehozadak, the high priest: ²"The Lord of Armies says this: These people say: The time has not come for the house of the Lord to be rebuilt." ³The word of the Lord came through the prophet Haggai:⁴"Is it a time for you yourselves to live in your paneled houses, while this house lies in ruins?" ⁵Now, the Lord of Armies says this: "Think carefully about your ways: ⁶You have planted much but harvested little. You eat but never have enough to be satisfied. You drink but never have enough to be happy. You put on clothes but never have enough to get warm. The wage earner puts his wages into a bag with a hole in it." ⁷The Lord of Armies says this: "Think carefully about your ways. ⁸Go up into the hills, bring down lumber, and build the house; and I will be pleased with it and be glorified," says the Lord. ⁹"You expected much, but then it amounted to little. When you brought the harvest to your house, I ruined it. Why?" This is the declaration of the Lord of Armies. "Because my house still lies in ruins, while each of you is busy with his own house. ¹⁰So on your account, the skies have withheld the dew and the land its crops. ¹¹I have summoned a drought on the fields and the hills, on the grain, new wine, fresh oil, and whatever the ground yields, on people and animals, and on all that your hands produce."

THE PEOPLE'S RESPONSE

¹²Then Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, the high priest Joshua son of Jehozadak, and the entire remnant of the people obeyed the Lord their God and the words of the prophet Haggai, because the Lord their God had sent him. So the people feared the Lord. ¹³Then Haggai, the Lord's messenger, delivered the Lord's message to the people: "I am with you — this is the Lord's declaration." ¹⁴The Lord roused the spirit of Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, the spirit of the high priest Joshua son of Jehozadak, and the spirit of all the remnant of the people. They began work on the house of the Lord of Armies, their God, ¹⁵on the twenty-fourth day of the sixth month, in the second year of King Darius.

CHAPTER TWO

ENCOURAGEMENT AND PROMISE

¹On the twenty-first day of the seventh month, the word of the Lord came through the prophet Haggai: ²"Speak to Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, to the high priest Joshua son of Jehozadak, and to the remnant of the people: ³'Who is left among you who saw this house in its former glory? How does it look to you now? Doesn't it seem to you like nothing by comparison? ⁴Even so, be strong, Zerubbabel — this is the Lord's declaration. Be strong, Joshua son of Jehozadak, high priest. Be strong, all you people of the land — this is the Lord's declaration. Work! For I am with you — the declaration of the Lord of Armies. ⁵This is the promise I made to you when you came out of Egypt, and my Spirit is present among you; don't be afraid.'"

HAGGAI

CHAPTER TWO (CONTINUED)

⁶For the Lord of Armies says this: "Once more, in a little while, I am going to shake the heavens and the earth, the sea and the dry land. ⁷I will shake all the nations so that the treasures of all the nations will come, and I will fill this house with glory," says the Lord of Armies. ⁸"The silver and gold belong to me" — this is the declaration of the Lord of Armies. ⁹"The final glory of this house will be greater than the first," says the Lord of Armies. "I will provide peace in this place" — this is the declaration of the Lord of Armies.

FROM DEPRIVATION TO BLESSING

¹⁰On the twenty-fourth day of the ninth month, in the second year of Darius, the word of the Lord came to the prophet Haggai: ¹¹"This is what the Lord of Armies says: Ask the priests for a ruling. ¹²If a man is carrying consecrated meat in the fold of his garment, and it touches bread, stew, wine, oil, or any other food, does it become holy?" The priests answered, "No." ¹³Then Haggai asked, "If someone defiled by contact with a corpse touches any of these, does it become defiled?" The priests answered, "It becomes defiled." ¹⁴Then Haggai replied, "So is this people, and so is this nation before me — this is the Lord's declaration. And so is every work of their hands; even what they offer there is defiled. ¹⁵"Now from this day on, think carefully: Before one stone was placed on another in the Lord's temple, ¹⁶what state were you in? When someone came to a grain heap of twenty measures, it only amounted to ten; when one came to the winepress to dip fifty measures from the vat, it only amounted to twenty. ¹⁷I struck you — all the work of your hands — with blight, mildew, and hail, but you didn't turn to me — this is the Lord's declaration. ¹⁸From this day on, think carefully; from the twenty-fourth day of the ninth month, from the day the foundation of the Lord's temple was laid; think carefully. ¹⁹Is there still seed left in the granary? The vine, the fig, the pomegranate, and the olive tree have not yet produced. But from this day on I will bless you."

PROMISE TO ZERUBBABEL

²⁰The word of the Lord came to Haggai a second time on the twenty-fourth day of the month: ²¹"Speak to Zerubbabel, governor of Judah: I am going to shake the heavens and the earth. ²²I will overturn royal thrones and destroy the power of the Gentile kingdoms. I will overturn chariots and their riders. Horses and their riders will fall, each by his brother's sword. ²³On that day" — this is the declaration of the Lord of Armies — "I will take you, Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, my servant" — this is the Lord's declaration — "and make you like my signet ring, for I have chosen you." This is the declaration of the Lord of Armies.
